2023 WAS AN INCREDIBLE YEAR FOR THRIVE INTERNATIONAL!



Thousands of people were empowered and several new programs emerged as partners joined our mission of empowering multicultural communities to Thrive. Highlights of the year include Thrive Center's 1st anniversary celebration, youth soccer camp, 2 women-only pool parties, a sold-out "Shine Bright" gala in November, and a very recent emergency housing program for over 200 asylum seekers who had been living in tents in Seattle. It continually inspires me how deeply this vision for thriving resonates with donors, volunteers, policy makers, social media friends, and especially among the immigrant communities we exist to serve. Everyone desires the opportunity to live their best life, and we as come together from all walks of life we all have something to contribute to a vibrant community. I shared hundreds of smiles, hugs, and handshakes last year, and I can't wait to share more in 2024. Together, we Thrive!

THIS YEAR WE FOUND LOCAL SOLUTIONS TO A GLOBAL CRISIS.

Thrive has officially completed 22 months as of December 2023.

We've stepped into a very complex and challenging set of issues and succeeded in helping people in truly life-changing ways.

In 2023, Thrive continued to help 419 refugee families with transitional housing at Thrive Center. Immediately after the Russian-Ukrainian war crisis when Ukrainian refugees began pouring into Washington State, our primary support went to this population in 2022. We have also empowered Afghan, Belarusian, Congolese, Syrian, Sudanese, and Venezuelan families through the housing program.

We are working with local partners (Millennium NW, 4 Degrees, The Inland Group, and others) to create new permeate housing solutions in Spokane for refugees.

Another exciting development to share! In December, King County started contracting with Thrive to provide temporary shelter for 300 immigrants who were living in tents. Now, Thrive manages 100 rooms in a hotel near Seattle Airport.

In 2023: we helped more than 2,000 refugees move from surviving to thriving.



After three months of living in Spokane alone as a Ukrainian refugee, Kateryna was reunited with her husband and daughter at the Spokane International Airport on the last day of November.

WE SUPPORT WOMEN TO DREAM AND THRIVE.

In many societies, women don't have equal opportunities to achieve their potential and find fulfillment. For refugees and immigrants, this can be exacerbated by the complexities of adapting to a new culture and community. Thrive International empowers women by creating peer support groups, cultivating practical skills, and connecting women with the resources they need to thrive.

In 2023, we served over 253 participants from the Women Empowerment Program through our monthly Tea Party (Bloom Together Project), driving class, beading class (Mahima Project), and Zumba class. We also have provided a safe and fun place for over 80 children with the provision of child care. The monthly tea is the highlight of the women's empowerment program. It is a way to gather, laugh, share tea, play games, and most importantly feel safe to share thoughts without being judged by others.

Thrive is happy to be a safe place for women where they can meet together, encourage each other, and share their unique experiences as refugees.

ALL REFUGEES AND IMMIGRANTS ARE WELCOME AT THRIVE INTERNATIONAL.

Thrive's Welcoming and Empowerment Team (WE Team) provides direct help to refugees and immigrants. Our resource coordinators in the WE Team work with refugee populations to refer them to resources that can help them build new, stable lives in the United States. As immigrants and refugees themselves, our resource coordinators are skilled and have experience in navigating the U.S. immigration system, in addition to speaking the native languages of the clients.

In 2023, WE Team connected refugees and immigrants with resources for clothing, education, housing, healthcare, and jobs. The team was created in June but has already reached out to about thousand people in 2023. Slavic (Russia + Ukraine), Afghan (Afghanistan), and Arabic (Iraq, Jordan, Egypt, Syria, Sudan, Palestine) are the main three groups that we served, plus we have had a few Spanish speakers from Venezuela as well.

This summer, WE Team hosted two all-women's pool parties that celebrated differences and empowered women from multiple cultures. The events were held respectively on July 14 and August 25 at Thrive Center, highlighting inclusivity for 80+ women whose cultural, political, or religious communities require women-only settings for swimming/bathing.




